Bob Siegel, MD is the Director of the Center for Better Health and Nutrition at Cincinnati Children's Hospital Medical Center. The CBHN is one of the largest pediatric weight management programs in the US.

Dr. Siegel is originally from Brooklyn, New York, is a graduate of NYU School of Medicine, did his residency at Cincinnati Children's Hospital and then was a practicing general pediatrician for over 20 years.

He is currently a Professor of Pediatrics at the University of Cincinnati and a diplomate of the American Board of Obesity Medicine. He has been principal investigator on several studies on pediatric obesity and has over 100 peer-reviewed articles and presentations.

Dr. Siegel and his wife Claudia have 3 sons. His current research interests include behavioral economic principles to improve food selection and interventions to improve weight status in children with obesity.

Christine White, MD, MAIT, is Associate Professor of Pediatrics at the University of Cincinnati and Associate Chief of Staff-Inpatient Service at Cincinnati Children's Hospital Medical Center in the Division of Hospital Medicine. Dr. White is a graduate of the University of Missouri-Columbia School of Medicine. She completed her pediatrics residency and chief residency at Cincinnati Children's Hospital.

Dr. White's interests and research focus on quality improvement with an expertise in the application of quality improvement sciences to improve inpatient systems of care. Dr. White has led efforts on patient safety, including initiatives to raise rates of medication reconciliation completion, to increase physician compliance with hand hygiene, to improve communication at night, and to improve discharge efficiency through standardization of discharge criteria. This last project, which significantly decreased length of stay without increasing readmission rates, earned the 2013 Children's Hospital Association Pediatric Quality Award.

Dr. Reddy is a Professor of Urology at the University of Cincinnati, School of Medicine and the Division Director of Pediatric Urology at Cincinnati Children's Hospital Medical Center.

Dr. Reddy specializes in general pediatric urological surgery, kidney stones, minimally invasive robotic-assisted surgery, complex genitourinary reconstructive surgery, including - re-operative hypospadias repair, anorectal malformations, disorders of sex development (DSD), neurogenic bladder, renal transplant in the neurogenic bladder.

Dr. Reddy has a specialized global health focus in the management of children with Bladder Exstrophy, he serves as the Director of the Bladder Exstrophy program at Cincinnati Children's Hospital. He travels annually to India for the International Bladder Exstrophy Consortium to provide care for children in the Indian subcontinent – this program is in its 12th year.

Dr. Reddy is also a leader in the field of fetal urology, this includes prenatal evaluation and in-utero interventions.

Dr. Reddy is actively involved in basic science research- involving bladder dysfunction and he also routinely conducts clinical trials for pediatric medications.

He is certified by the American Board of Urology with subspecialty certification in Pediatric Urology.

Dr. Reddy is committed to the complete, holistic care of all patients and emphasizes the principle of 'Cura Personalis' – Care of the whole person in each of his clinical interactions.
